The EU is looking for specialists in external relations

Are you a specialist in the field of external relations? Are you keen to promote the EU's values in its relations with third countries? If yes, then read on.

The European Union is looking for specialists with professional experience in the field of external relations. Recruited specialists (grades AD 5 and AD 7) will mainly work in the European External Action Service (EEAS), which is the EU's diplomatic service, helping the EU's High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy carry out the Union's Common Foreign and Security Policy. Based in Brussels, but relying on an extensive network of EU diplomatic presence worldwide, the EEAS brings together European civil servants, diplomats from the foreign services of the EU member states and local staff in countries around the world

Your **main tasks** will be to promote and protect the EU's interests and values in its relations with third countries and international organisations, and to contribute to the conduct of the Union's Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP). Additionally, you will cooperate with the national diplomatic services of the EU Member States, the Council and the European Commission, in order to ensure consistency between different areas of the Union's external action.

To apply for grade AD 5 (graduate administrator entry level grade), you need a university degree of at least 3 years followed by at least 1 year of professional experience in external relations. For the higher grade (AD 7), you need either a university degree of at least 3 years followed by at least 7 years of professional experience in the field of external relations, or a university degree of at least 4 years followed by at least 6 years of relevant professional experience. Additionally, you must be an EU citizen and have a thorough knowledge of one of the 24 EU languages and a satisfactory knowledge of either English or French.

Please note that all EEAS staff periodically serve in Union Delegations. Those recruited must be willing to accept a first posting in a delegation in a country where living conditions can be difficult.
